A - B is small, what can one say about A and B? A more specific question is as follows: if A is a finite non-empty subset of integers such that |A + A| = K|A| for some small number K, what can one say about A? Here and in the rest of the text we use |A| to denote the cardinality of a finite set A. The number K := |A + A|/|A| is referred to as the *doubling constant* of A and will be denoted in this text by $\sigma[A]$. It is easy to see that this constant is at least 1, but it can be much larger; for instance, if A is a geometric progression such as $A = 2^{n}[0, N) = \{1, 2, 2^{2}, ..., 2^{N-1}\}$
