









RSC's committed to OA

- Find other sustainable and affordable models to support the transition but protect our journals
- We combined subscription and Open Access licenses and created a transparent hybrid model (Read & Publish)








Conclusions

- OA cannot be achieved without support of research intensive countries
- Conversion of a journal to OA is likely to result in decline of submissions
- Given the current situation publishers will not risk their authorship and will not mass convert their journals to OA
- Researchers' academic freedom should not be limited
- Models employing hybrid is a sustainable (if not the only) way to transit from subscription to OA, hence OA initiatives which are in denial or concealed denial of that are unreasonable or at least premature.
