





# UGOE Open Access Policy

**Open Access Resolution**, Dec 2005: Letter by the President to all academic staff, recommendation to use OA journals, disciplinary repositories and the institutional OA repository

**Open Access Policy**, June resp. Nov 2016 (UGOE resp. UMG): States principles and actions/support for their implementation

# UGOE Open Access Policy in a nutshell

- (1) The University **promotes and supports OA to publications**
- (2) **Authors should not transfer exclusive rights** via publishing contracts & **at least retain nonexclusive** rights in order to enable dissemination in OA.
- (3) Authors are asked to **deposit a copy** of their publication **immediately upon publication into GoeScholar**, UGOE's institutional repository.
- (4) **Publication with OA publishers is supported.** **Publication costs** should be taken into account in grant proposals. In addition, UGOE operates an **OA publication fund** (managed by SUB Göttingen).

# Research data policy

**Research data policy** since July 2014 (UGOE and UMG)

**Göttingen eResearch Alliance (eRA)** established in 2014, jointly by the library (SUB) and the scientific computing centre (GWDG)

# UGOE Research data policy

1. The University **promotes and supports open access to research data.**
- 2., 3. Definitions
4. RDM is **generally the responsibility of the person leading a project and the researcher** who is acting in an individual capacity...
5. Research projects with research data **require a research data management plan...**
6. The University provides **support and advice** for RDM during the preparatory stages of research project, during their conduct and after their completion, and provides appropriate training.
7. The University implements and maintains essential **services...**
8. **Storage and archiving** within the University's IT infrastructure
9. **Ethics, data protection, IPR, privacy and disclosure**
10. **Exploitation:** ... data **should remain openly and freely available for research purposes**

- Prehistory
  - Research support office: advisor on research data since 2011
  - Since 2012: embedded data managers in large collaborative projects via SUB's R&D department
  - Data policy July 2014, start of eRA in late 2014
- Main service areas
  - Support for storing, sharing, publishing or citing data
  - Consulting on RDM topics, e.g. DMPs, legal and ethical aspects
  - Training, e.g. graduate schools
  - Network of experts, link to related services

# DFG Statement on the Establishment of “cOAlition S” to Support Open Access

- The DFG **welcomes** a coordinated approach among funding organisations towards the realisation of open access.
- The DFG (...) will strengthen its policy by requesting researchers to make results from DFG funding openly available.
- The DFG encourages researchers to **retain copyright** and has implemented clauses in its regulations accordingly.
- The **DFG funds the establishment of high quality open access journals, repositories and platforms**. In addition, a number of **support services for open access**, including services for hosting and archiving, receive DFG funding.
- The DFG contributes to vital international infrastructures for open access such as the **Directory of Open Access Journals**.
- The DFG has funding schemes for **institutional coverage of APC** with a **standardised price cap** as well as for licence negotiations including open access publications.
- The DFG participates in nationwide coordinated efforts such as the **Project DEAL** or the National Contact Point **Open Access OA2020-DE**

# Reactions to Plan S & other concerns

- **Plan S:** Some UGOE chemists have signed the open letter on plan S by Kamerlin et al.  
>> approached subject librarians to find out what the library position is (contribution, lobbying?)
- **License negotiations:** Project DEAL of the German Alliance of Science Organisations, negotiations are on-going – progress, but no deal with Elsevier foreseen in the near future.  
>> 30+ journal editors / researchers urge the negotiators on both sides to continue negotiations and take into account the negative effects which result for ECRs from the current situation





# OA Publication Fund at UGOE


Publication fund since 2012, and several agreements with publishers since 2007

## Rules of funding

- **Corresponding author** is affiliated with the UGOE
- **Up to 2,000 EUR** (higher fees may be covered through university funds)
- The article is published in a **pure Open Access journal**
- The journal has established a **peer-review** process that complies with the standards of the disciplinary community (-> check DOAJ.org)
- The article **acknowledges the funding** of the German Research Foundation and UGOE, e.g.: We acknowledge support by the German Research Foundation and the Open Access Publication Funds of the Göttingen University.




# Distribution by discipline

### Open Science - Wege zu einer offeneren und transparenteren Wissenschaft

Innovationen und wissenschaftlicher Fortschritt treiben die moderne Wissensgesellschaft an. Aktuell zeigt sich allerdings in vielen wissenschaftlichen Disziplinen, darunter auch in der Psychologie, dass sich zentrale Befunde nicht replizieren lassen. Häufig genannte Gründe für diese Replikationskrise sind falsche Anreize im wissenschaftlichen System wie z.B. ein zu hoher Publikationsdruck sowie die Intransparenz des Erkenntnisgewinnungsprozesses, die unsaubere Arbeit und fragwürdige wissenschaftliche Praktiken begünstigen können. ### **Professorship (W3 salary level, tenured) in „Clinical Psychology and Psychotherapy“**

The position will be available at the Georg-Elias-Müller-Institute of Psychology, belonging to the Faculty of Biology and Psychology. Earliest starting date is 1 October 2018.

The University is looking for researchers with an excellent, internationally visible research profile in clinical psychology that fits into the research program of the Institute of Psychology (focusing on basic psychological research in biological psychology, cognition, and social psychology). Applicants should have a proven track-record in acquiring competitive third-party grants.

Teaching responsibilities of the professorship include the entire field of clinical psychology and psychotherapy in the B.Sc. and M.Sc. programs in psychology. In addition, the professorship is responsible for the continuation of the current post-graduate study program “Psychological Psychotherapy” at the University of Göttingen. The teaching language in all of these programs is German. More detailed information about the professorship can be found at <http://www.psych.uni-goettingen.de/news/jobs/clinical-psychology>.

Appointments will be made by the university according to the Higher Education Act of Lower Saxony (Niedersächsisches Hochschulgesetz), particularly §25. Further details are given on request.

Applicants should hold a doctoral degree, have an outstanding research and teaching record, and a German approbation as a psychological psychotherapist or equivalent practical qualification.

Applications by advanced junior scientists, and by scientists from foreign countries are explicitly encouraged. The Institute aims for open, transparent and reproducible research, in line with the recent recommendations by the German Society of Psychology (Deutsche Gesellschaft für Psychologie, DGPs). Applicants are asked to outline how they have pursued these goals in the past, and how they plan to do so in the future.

The University of Göttingen intends to increase the proportion of women in research and teaching in areas where they are, so far, underrepresented and, hence, strongly encourages female scientists to apply. The University of Göttingen is an equal-opportunities employer. Furthermore, the university pursues the goal of hiring more disabled persons. Therefore, priority will be given to disabled persons with equivalent qualifications.

For scientific progress, it is pivotal to review research findings by independently replicating results, thus making the findings more reliable. However, in econometric research, it is not yet common





Which of the following aspects of an Open Science strategy/roadmap at the institutional level is most important for you? (please select up to 3)



- **Target transparency, reproducibility & quality of research**
- **A model sentence for all UGOE job postings**  
>> following the psychology example
- **Incentives and rewards**, rethink research assessment
- **Education and training** of junior researchers, qualification of staff  
>> integrate OS into research integrity trainings (e.g. GAUSS graduate school)

- **Continue to promote OS learning opportunities & good practices** (more likely through a roadmap than a policy)
