
## Background

## Mixed-media webpages


- Springshare's LibGuide

### YouTube videos


- Formal webinar format

## Virtual workshop sessions

- Allowed continuation of previous offer in a new format
- Flipped classroom
- Live demos and in-person interaction
- Gamified online sessions





#### What has worked

- Reach a wider range of users
- Accessible from the outset
- Multiple formats for the same content
- Enabled innovation amongst the team and beyond



## What hasn't worked so well

- Embedding issues with tutorials
- Some lack of interaction in live sessions
- Some content difficult to update
- Lack of feedback



### Feedback

- Remove restrictions on booking numbers
- Live demos helpful, and requested links in chat to allow participants to work along
- Breakout rooms helpful for small group discussion
