





## Collaborative Open Access Library Hosting in Scotland

## About Edinburgh Diamond 🕀

- Edinburgh Diamond is based within the University of Edinburgh library and provides publishing services for academics and students who wish to publish Diamond Open Access books, journals and conference proceedings
- **2009:** launch of journal hosting service, using OJS
- **2021:** launch of book hosting service, using OMP
- 2021: rebranded as Edinburgh Diamond
- **2023:** 20 journals, 11 books
- The Edinburgh Diamond service is provided free of charge to staff and students of the University of Edinburgh
- **BUT,** separately, we also provide a shared service with other institutions around Scotland







**SCURL:** Scottish Confederation of University & Research Libraries

**Mission:** SCURL is a membership body that supports service development and improvement across Scotland's university and research libraries. Key areas of work are coordination, collaboration and advocacy.

#### Aims:


- improve services for users and maximise resource through collaborative action
- collaborate towards the creation of a co-operative library infrastructure in Scotland
- advocate the contributions and benefits of library services to stakeholders
- provide mutual support for members.





#### SCURL Shared Service | Open Hosting

- 2018: UoE submitted a proposal to create a shared service governed by SCURL
- **Aim:** to equip member institutions with a hosting solution to fulfil their Open Access publishing activities, with the development time charged to the University of Edinburgh
- Fee: Currently £1,400 + VAT per year (not for profit)
- Launch: three members
- 2023: eleven members
- Meetings: four times a year



- Ongoing technical support, upgrades & migrations


- Guidance with:

#### Service Doesn't Include:


- Workflow management

- Copyediting services
- Typesetting services





#### Benefits of a Shared Hosting Service


- Flexible hosting and publishing solutions e.g.
  - St Andrews: hosting service
  - RBGE: publishing arm of membership group
  - SUP: publisher
- Pooling knowledge
- Teamwork
- Innovation





#### Challenges of a Shared Hosting Service

- Resource
- Financial barriers
- Lots of voices (pros and cons)
- Conflicting opinions (rare!)






#### Feedback from Partners
