Our services and metadata are provided completely free of charge to all.






Evolution of the DOAJ over time






DOAJ from 2003 to 2024

Number of journals indexed in DOAJ







Geographic spread of journals in DOAJ 2003









Geographic spread of journals in DOAJ 2024






DOAJ raises the profile of non-English language journals

Collaborate with other organisations (Research4Life, AJOL, WACREN, EIFL, SciELO, LAtindex and local universities) to develop training for journal editors in Africa and Latin America.

Advocate for OA and the importance of DOAJ indexing to **policy- and decision-makers** (Ex:Open Science events in Nigeria)

3

Extend ambassador programme: individuals fluent in **Portuguese** (Latin America) and **French** (Central, East, West Africa) to promote Open Access, DOAJ, and assist journals in indexing.

- In 2023, Ambassadors took part in 61 public engagements and events around the world


Our ambassador programme
