Who is participating?

- Leiden not yet fully aligned with the NUPs principles
- Different levels of maturity, size, and development
- Future expectation for more Dutch Universities:
 - with own diamond OA University Press
 - being part of the NUPs collaboration
 - or part of the national diamond infrastructure



Short history of NUPs

- Started about two years ago
- Many common topics to discuss
- Highly ambitious and enthusiastic group with the need of its own community
- Positioned within the library, but:
 - the library's focus primary on information for the reader
 - the press's focus on the author
 - same people but with totally different needs
- In two years NUPs converged into concrete projects and plans



Where are we now

The 5 DOA presses together have 362 OA books and 50 journals

Leiden University Press has more than 150 titles in open access and participates in Path to Open



Next steps forward

- Increasing awareness and outreach Institutional support
- Funding and financial models Reallocation of budgets, membership models, grants with prolonged possibilities to publish a book
- Impact measurement and quality standards research and analysis of OA Book usage
- Sharing best practices of researchers and peers Success stories, feedback
- Infrastructure (shared?) and platform development
- Innovation in publishing practices
 Experiment with formats, use open licences, multilingual publishing
- National and international collaboration



Next steps forward

- NUPs working on:
 - A joint catalogue and metadata management system
 - Exploring a shared publishing platform for books and textbooks
 - Exploring semi-automatic journal formatting through the XML process
 - Establishing a (formal) collaboration framework for NUPs

- Thoth is developing an export plugin from OMP to Thoth
- Beta-tested the plugin, in general it works
- Some issues with metadata, html presentation and identifier validation
